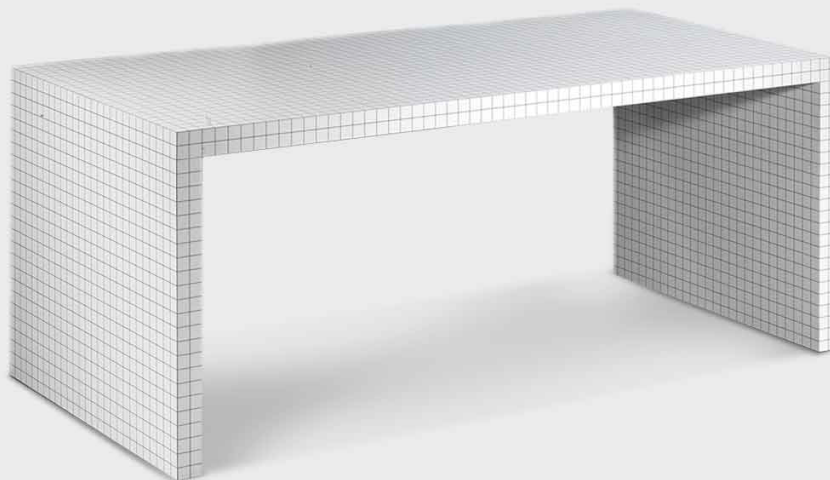

Biography

Superstudio was an Italian group of architecture, art and design established in 1966 in Florence, Italy by Adolfo Natalini and Cristiano Toraldo di Francia. This studio was one of the main members of the radical architectural movement of the late 1960s. They published a catalogue with shapes inspired by architecture that were based on the square. Later, Superstudio also designed a collection of furniture that was inspired by the same thinking and was produced by Zanotta under the name 'Quaderna'. Superstudio ended its collective work in 1978, but its members continued to develop their ideas independently through their writings, education, architectural design and other creative projects.
