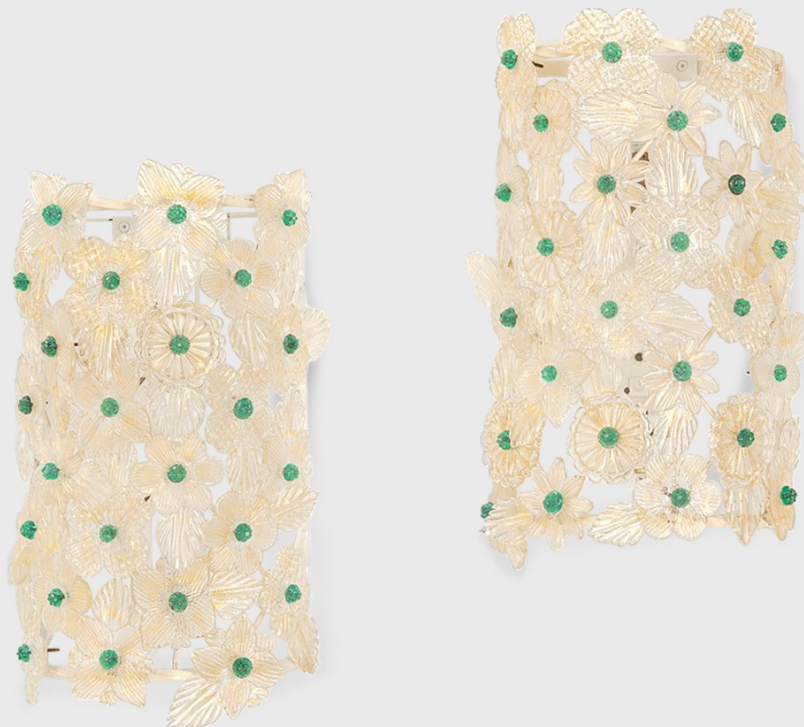

Biography

Flavio Poli (b.1900, Chioggia, Italy - d.1984) He was a prominent glass designer and artist who made significant contributions to the world of Murano glass.
